<p><b>The school makes provision for the following kinds of SEN</b></p>	<p><i>As a specialist setting Cambridge Park Academy caters for pupils with a range of complex needs including severe learning difficulties/disabilities (SLD) and autism. Approximately 48% of pupils attending the academy have a diagnosis of autism or communication and interaction associated with an autistic profile.</i></p>
<p><b>The school identifies and assesses SEN by:</b></p>	<p><i>All pupils attending Cambridge Park Academy already have an identified primary need set out within their EHCP. If parents, staff or external professionals identify the possibility of additional needs that require assessment, the pastoral team have the capacity to access referrals to the relevant local pathway offer.</i></p>
<p><b>The school ensures that the admissions process is fair for pupils with SEN or a disability by</b></p>	<p><i>The Local Authority determines which pupils are admitted to the school and supports those pupils placed here. The Local Authority moderates all applications and decides which pupils are most suitable for placement, in agreement with the school. Occasionally assessment places are offered to pupils who are new to the area. There is an appeal process for families who make an unsuccessful bid for a place at the school for their child.</i></p>

<p><b>The school will secure equipment and facilities for children with SEND by:</b></p>	<p><i>Subject leads ensure that the identified needs of the children dictate spending in line with requirements.</i></p> <p><i>Provision identified through pupil’s individual EHCPs inform spending.</i></p> <p><i>The Academy has an ever growing strategy to develop grant applications. Last academic year the Academy’s English Lead was successful in securing a £10,000 grant to spend on books</i></p>

<p><b>The school aims to involve the parents and children with SEND in the education of the children and will do so by:</b></p>	<p><i>Cambridge Park Academy ensures that statutory timelines with respect to reviewing EHCPs are strategically planned. Annual reviews are scheduled by the SEN Administrator. Paperwork is shared with parents in a timely manner prior to the meeting via the Local Authority Hub to ensure their views are gathered.</i></p> <p><i>The Academy employs a Personal Development and Transition Lead who is responsible for organising regular coffee mornings. This allows for external professionals to engage with parents in a less formal environment.</i></p> <p><i>A parental survey is completed twice per year to gather parent voice</i></p> <p><i>Parents evening is held twice yearly. Parents are invited to meet with the class teacher to discuss their child's progress.</i></p>
<p><b>Any concerns or complaints raised by a parent of a child with SEND will be dealt with by the school by:</b></p>	<p><i>Any concerns can be raised to the Principal or the Senior Leadership team.
